



• Financial assistance of Rs 10,000 was provided to Aiju J, second year, Department of English and Media Studies for paying hostel fee arrears on 17/02/2023.







• <u>2020-21</u>



PALLIATIVE CARE ACTIVITIES

• <u>2021-22</u>

Sree Ayyappa College, Eramallikkara has always played an extensive role in moulding the students into socially-committed individuals. The Palliative Care activities of 2022-23, "Saanthwanam" has pursued the following **aims and objectives**:

- 1. To render help to the maximum number of patients with the allotted amount
- 2. To identify the economically underprivileged palliative care patients
- 3. To lend helping hands for the mental well-being of children under palliative care.

The initial task was to form a team of volunteers who are genuinely interested to help palliative patients. As per the instruction of the National Service Scheme, University of Kerala, two volunteers from Sree Ayyappa College participated in the training programme.

A three-day residential training program on Palliative care was conducted from July 27-29 2022 at Kerala University Student Centre PMJ Junction, Thiruvananthapuram. Abhiraj PK, a student of B. Sc Electronics represented Sree Ayyappa College, Eramallikkara in this program.





Blood Donation Camp

2017-2018

Blood donation camps are crucial for meeting the demand for blood in hospitals and medical facilities. Sree Ayyappa College joined in this endeavour with HDFC Bank and organized a blood donation camp on October 13, 2017. The camp was inaugurated by Dr. S. Anil Kumar. Apart from the blood donation camp organised at the institute, students of Sree Ayyappa College voluntarily donated their blood to four different hospitals.


• <u>2022-23</u>






